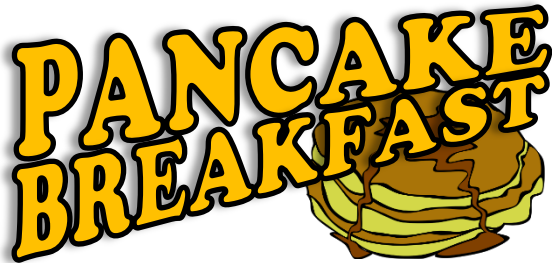

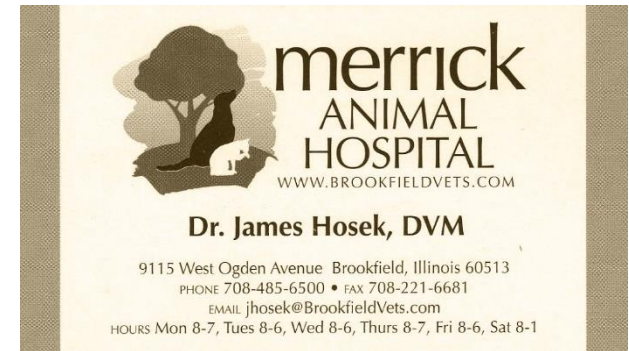

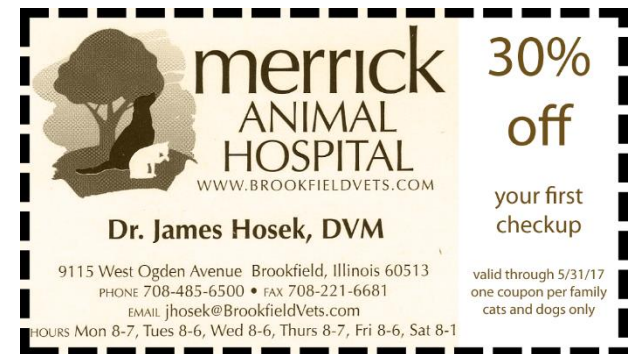


Standard Ad Based on your Business Card:

HERE ARE SOME OF THE WAYS THE TROOP HELPS SUPPORT THE COMMUNITY WITH OUR PROGRAMS:

#1 PROVIDE POSITIVE ACTIVITIES FOR BOYS AGES 11 THROUGH 18 - Our 60 young men are provided with over 30 hours a month of positive activities including weekly meetings, campouts, and community service projects.

#2 PROVIDE SUMMER CAMPING AND HIGH ADVENTURE EXPERIENCES FOR OUR BOYS - In 2014, we had over 50 young men and adult leaders go to high adventure or summer camp for an entire week of activities including swimming, sailing, canoeing, sailing, lifesaving, and archery to name a few. Groups have also experienced high adventure activities such as whitewater rafting in the Appalachians, Philmont mountain backpacking treks, Apostle Islands kayaking, scuba training, boundary waters canoeing, high ropes courses, skiing, and luge sledding.

#3 SEND TROOP MEMBERS ON SERVICE PROJECTS THROUGHOUT THE COMMUNITY & CHICAGO AREA – including Greater Chicago Food Depository, Feed My Starving Children, Night Ministry Soup Kitchen, Feed6 Feed the Hungry project, Feed & Serve Recovering Veterans at Hines Hospital, Canned Food Drives, and more.

#4 MENTOR OUR BOY MEMBERS TO WORK THRU THEIR RANKS ALL THE WAY UP TO THE PRESTIGIOUS RANK OF EAGLE SCOUT – our troop has a higher rate of Eagle scouts than the national average. Over the last five (6) years 21 boys in Troop 24 made the rank of Eagle Scout. Each did a service project specifically in and for the community of their creation. Some of these were:



- Painting the historic lamp poles in Riverside
- Beautifying the grounds at retirement homes for the residents to enjoy
- Creating a new garden setting at a local church
- Cleaning out and organizing the basement of the Loyola Medical Center Ronald McDonald House
- Painting and refreshing rooms at the Ronald McDonald House
- A book drive for youth specifically to learn how fun it is to read
- Halloween youth decorating event with local businesses to encourage residents to enjoy the art made by kids in their community
- Rebuilt a number of benches in downtown Riverside for business patrons to sit and enjoy the downtown while shopping
- Improved the landscaping by the Riverside Post Office and adjacent parking lot
- Cleaned out, relocated and helped organized village records from the location under the old water tower to Village Hall
- Rebuilt and improved the baseball diamond and seating behind Hauser for youth and adults alike to enjoy in a safer and newer setting

- Built 4 raised planter gardens for disadvantaged senior veterans at Hines Hospital to enjoy.
- Built a shelving unit for the Riverside Arts Center
- Built Wood Duck houses along the Des Plaines River to help restore the natural habitat
- Built 14 classic style band stands for RB High School Jazz Band
- Built garden tuteurs and raised garden beds for the St Mary's Church garden
- Created a Pollinator Garden for the Riverside Library
- Built shoe cubbies for Ames School
- Collected art supplies for the Constance Morris house, domestic violence shelter
- Constructed new fire pit at the Riverside Scout Cabin
